

## NATIONAL POLLUTANT RELEASE INVENTORY

### **Applicable legislation:**

NPRI is legislated under the sections 46-50 of the Canadian Environmental Protection Act (CEPA).

The National Pollutant Release Inventory (NPRI) is a program created and maintained by Environment Canada to provide information about pollutant release (to the air, water and land) and transfer (for recycling).

Companies that are required to report and choose not to, or knowingly report false information, will be prosecuted as outlined under Section 272 and 273 of the Canadian Environmental Protection Act.

The primary goal of the NPRI is to track and monitor pollutant release across Canada. This information is available to the public upon request. The NPRI is updated annually using the online secure program provided by the government, called "One Window to National Environmental Reporting System" (OWNERS).

NPRI is due on June 1<sup>st</sup> every year for the previous calendar year's release.

### Reporting Thresholds:

Any facility that meets or exceeds the reporting criteria is required to provide the information required by NPRI.
